

Strengthening border infrastructure not only improves the logistics of our armed forces but also contributes to the local economy.


Under the decisive leadership of Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, the government is fully geared up to face any security challenge.

LANDMARK ACHIEVEMENT

India gets its first Chief of Defence Staff

To increase efficiency and coordination, while reducing duplication, a new position was introduced that would usher greater jointness in the Armed Forces – making him the chief military adviser to the Government of India and the Ministry of Defence.



CABINET SECRETARIAT NOTIFICATION

S.O. 4710(E).—In exercise of the powers conferred by clause (3) of article 77 of the Constitution, the President hereby makes the following rules further to amend the Government of India (Allocation of Business) Rules, 1961, namely:-

- 1. (1) These rules may be called the Government of India (Allocation of Business) Three Hundred and Fifty Third Amendment Rules, 2019.
 - (2) They shall come into force at once.
- 2. In the Government of India (Allocation of Business) Rules, 1961,-
 - (A) in THE FIRST SCHEDULE, under the heading "9. Ministry of Defence (Raksha Mantralaya)", for the existing sub-headings, the following sub-headings shall be substituted, namely,—
 - "(i) Department of Defence (Raksha Vibhag)
 - (ii) Department of Military Affairs (Sainya Karya Vibhag)
 - (iii) Department of Defence Production (Raksha Utpadan Vibhag)
 - (iv) Department of Defence Research and Development (Raksha Anusandhanaur VikasVibh
 - (v) Department of Ex-Servicemen Welfare (PoorvaSenani Kalyan Vibhag)";

"AA. DEPARTMENT OF MILITARY AFFAIRS (SAINYA KARYA VIBHAG)

- 1. The Armed Forces of the Union, namely, Army, Navy and AirForce.
- 2. Integrated Headquarters of the Ministry of Defence comprising of Army Headquarters, Naval Headquarters, Air Headquarters and Defence Staff Headquarters.
- 3. The Territorial Army.
- 4. Works relating to Army, Navy and AirForce.
- 5. Procurement exclusive to the Services except capital acquisitions, as per prevalent rules and procedures.
- 6. Promoting jointness in procurement, training and staffing for the Services through joint planning and integration of their requirements.
- 7. Facilitation of restructuring of Military Commands for optimal utilisation of resources by bringing about jointness in operations, including through establishment of joint/theatre commands.
- 8. Promoting use of indigenous equipment by the Services.".

Launched in October 2020 - Fully digitized Land Management System in Ministry of Defence to enhance efficiency and speed of proposals for land transfer



Construction of Metro projects under defence land throughout the country made easier - New policy that states that no lease rent to be paid for tunnels under defence land, approved in July 2020



Equal Value Infrastructure in lieu of Defence Land | New policy framework to facilitate defence land for development projects including roads, highways, metros and other public utility projects | Policy approved in October 2020 | Completed process of 5 cases in 2 months; many more in the pipeline
